The Usawa Game draws its inspiration from qualitative research and firsthand narratives shared by young Malian villagers within their communities. These narratives formed an integral part of the Djonya Kêlè Ja Toulon project, aptly titled "Gaming against slavery." By delving into the rich cultural tapestry of Mali and the African continent, the game aims to foster a deeper understanding of the historical and contemporary complexities associated with descent-based slavery.
